

*Sister Eva Mesina, CSJ shared that in 1939, five Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet opened Holy Rosary School in Paia with 160 students. One of the first graduates, Ramona Cagasan Pencerga remembers Sister Roselani Enomoto, CSJ in grade school as the skinny girl with long braids! Other graduates include 87 years-old Margo Sombelon Kaiama, and founding members of the church, Bill and Martha Tavares' family.

*57 Dominican Lane is the postal address near St. Joseph's Church of the convent of the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary who began St. Joseph School in 1968.
