

THE JUBILEE YEAR CROSS PILGRIMS OF HOPE



The Diocese of Honolulu's Jubilee cross stands in the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa in Honolulu on the island of O'ahu.

To allow a greater participation in the Ordinary Jubilee Year in the Diocese of Honolulu, Bishop Silva has commissioned a traveling Jubilee Cross that will be hosted by every parish in the diocese throughout this year.

Jubilee indulgence may be obtained by visiting/venerating the Jubilee Cross when the ordinary conditions are met, namely, detachment from sin, sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion, and prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father, with one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be.

Explanation of the Icons on the traveling Jubilee Cross

1 - The resurrection of the Lord.

2 - The Mother of Perpetual Help - the Blessed Virgin Mary holding the infant Jesus, with archangels St. Michael and St. Gabriel standing before them.

3 - The crucifixion and death of Jesus

4 - A symbol of the enduring Marian devotion of Mary, Help of Christians, first coined by St. John Chrysostom in 345 A.D.

5 - A representation of Jesus as the vine, as stated in the Gospel of John: "I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit because, without me, you can do nothing" (John 15:5)

6 - The archangels St. Michael and St. Gabriel
