Homily

*Within this solemn celebration of Vespers, and according to the discipline of the Church, before assuming the office entrusted to him, the Bishop-elect publicly makes the **Profession of Faith** and takes the **Oath of Fidelity** in the presence of the People of God.*

Profession of Faith

In accordance with the law of the Church, the Bishop-elect solemnly professes the Catholic faith before assuming the office entrusted to him. Standing before God and His people, he recites the Creed, bearing witness to his full communion with the Church and to his steadfast belief in all that she teaches and proclaims as revealed by God. This public profession manifests his fidelity to the deposit of faith which he is called to guard and to hand on with integrity as a successor of the Apostles.

Oath of Fidelity

Following the Profession of Faith, the Bishop-elect takes the Oath of Fidelity, pledging obedience and loyalty to the Supreme Pontiff and his successors. In this solemn declaration, he promises to fulfill his episcopal ministry in communion with the Roman Pontiff and the College of Bishops, to uphold the unity of the Church, and to exercise his office with diligence, charity, and faithfulness. This act signifies his sincere commitment to serve the People of God in truth and love, in accord with the mission entrusted to him by Christ and His Church.

Blessing of Episcopal Insignia

In this blessing, the ring, miter, and pastoral staff are consecrated as visible signs of the bishop's fidelity to the Church, his service of Christ the High Priest, and his mission to shepherd God's people.

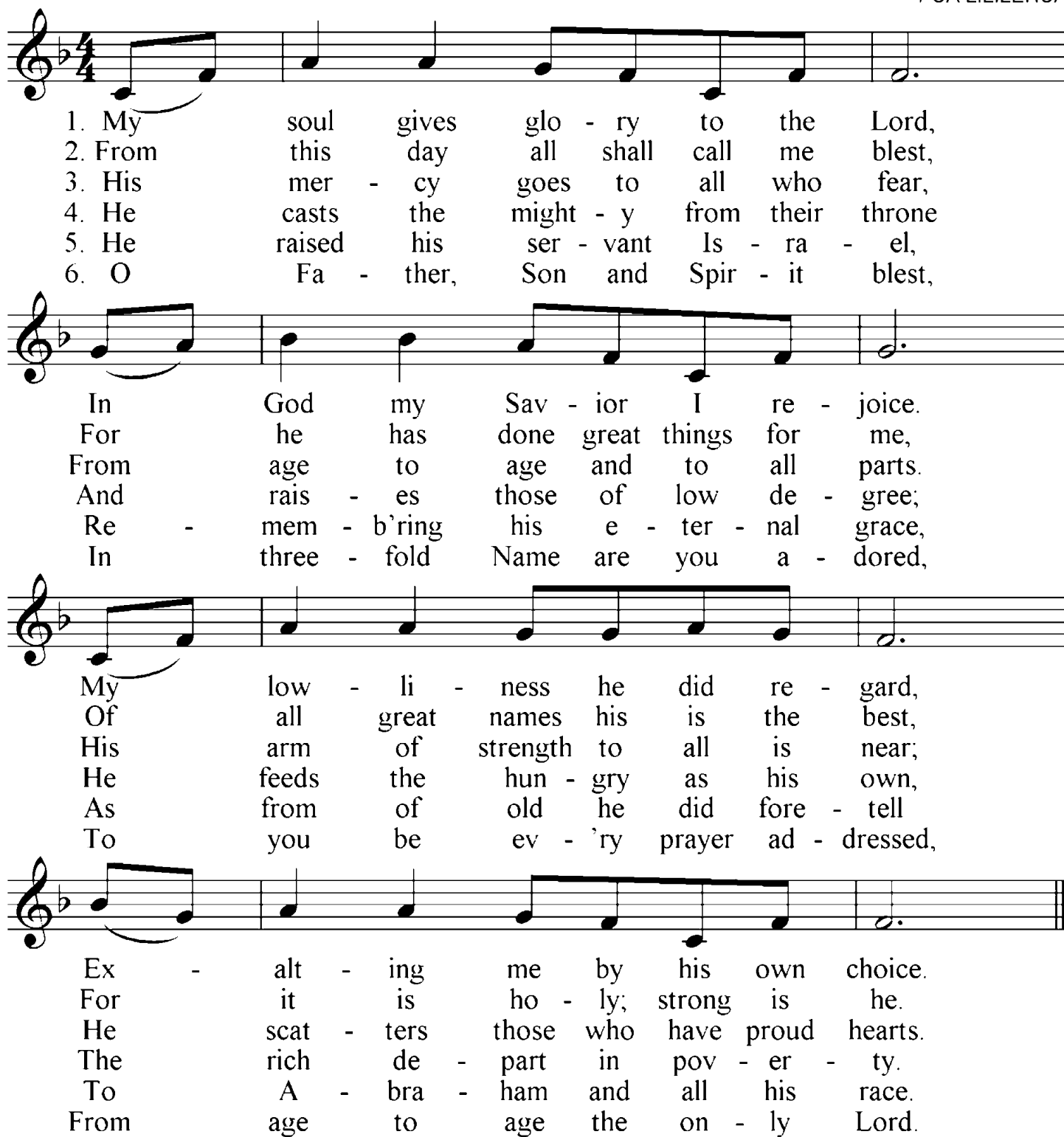

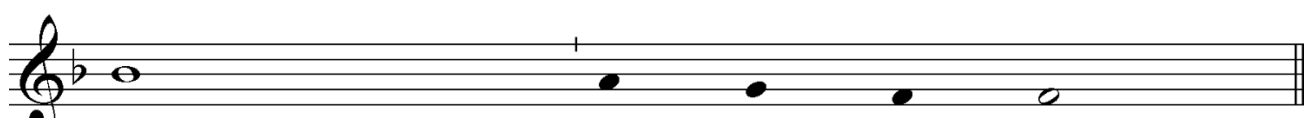

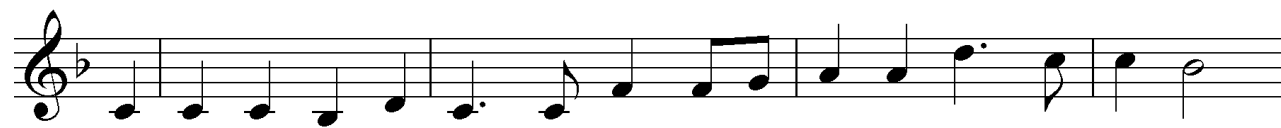
